# **BIOGRAPHIES:**

### PRESENTERS

**Ms.** Cécile Riallant leads the work of the International Organization for Migration (IOM) on migration and sustainable development as Head of Unit and Team Leader for IOM's dedicated institutional strategy. She is a senior migration, displacement and development expert with over 20 years of experience. Previously, Ms. Riallant was seconded to UNDP to manage the UN Joint Migration and Development Initiative (JMDI), the largest global UN programme on migration and development. She is also leading IOM's work to support governments and UN Country Teams with the Global Compact on Migration implementation in the context of the UN Network on Migration.

Since joining IOM in 2000, Ms. Riallant has managed numerous programmes and projects in the field of migration and displacement with geographical scope in the Great Lakes (Africa), Afghanistan, the Balkans and Europe. She was also Deputy Chief of Mission of the IOM Mission in Indonesia.

*Ms. Aiko Kikkawa Takenaka* is an Economist at the Economic Research and Cooperation Department of the Asian Development Bank. She covers research portfolio of aging and demographic changes, international migration and remittances, tourism and economic analysis of ADB projects. Prior to joining ADB, Ms. Takenaka was with the International Organization for Migration (IOM) where she led technical assistance programmes on overseas employment policy, remittances, and disaster relief operation targeting mobile population in multiple countries of Asia and Europe.

*Mr. William Gois* is the current regional coordinator of Migrant Forum in Asia (MFA), a regional network of grassroots organizations, trade unions, faith-based groups, migrants and their families and individual advocates in Asia working together for social justice for migrant workers and members of their families represented in 26 countries in Asia and the Middle East. Previously, Mr. Gois served as chairperson of the Global Coalition for Migration. Over the last twenty years, he has been at the forefront of international advocacy efforts, engaging and influencing international and multilateral processes to promote rights based migration and development policies, including within the frameworks of the Global Forum on Migration and Development, the World Bank led Global Knowledge Partnership on Migration and Development (KNOMAD). At the regional level, Mr. Gois represents Migrant Forum in Asia in the Abu Dhabi Dialogue Steering Committee on the Comprehensive Information Orientation and the thematic working groups of the Colombo Process.

*Ms. Sally Barber* is the Head of Labour Mobility and Human Development unit at IOM Thailand. She has over 10 years of experience with civil society, international organizations and universities. She has lived and worked extensively in the Greater Mekong Subregion (GMS), focusing on migration, labour rights, and gender equality.

#### DISCUSSANTS

*Mr. Than Aung Kyaw* is the Director General of the Foreign Economic Relations Department under the Ministry of Investment and Foreign Economic Relations of Myanmar. In this capacity, he leads economic cooperation efforts between line Ministries and international development partners to facilitate implementation of development programmes aimed at improving national socio-economic development.

Prior to this appointment, Mr. Kyaw served as Deputy Director General at the Ministry of President's Office and later in the Directorate of Investment and Company Administration (DICA) under the Ministry of National Planning and Economic Development, leading the work to enhance investment promotion and facilitation. Mr. Kyaw also worked for the Ministry of Commerce for over 28 years focusing on domestic and international trade. Mr. Kyaw is a member of the Development Assistance Coordination Unit (DACU) established by the Government to ensure effective utilization of external development assistance in Myanmar; and he also contributes to the processes of the ASEAN economic integration and Greater Mekong Sub-region Economic cooperation.

*Ms. Nansiri lamsuk* is the Programme Specialist working in the Migration Unit at UN Women Regional Office for Asia and the Pacific. Her work focuses on empowering women migrant workers through supporting them in accessing to gender-responsive Safe Migration services and information.

*Ms. Helga Nagy* is the Executive Director at the NGO École d'Hôtellerie et de Tourisme Paul Dubrule in Cambodia. She brings to this position more than two decades of international experience ranging from academia to operations, and in building strong local, national, international and donor-partner alliances. Helga's interest lies in the development of experiential learning and vocational education and training, with multiple journal article publications. Helga previously lectured at RMIT International University Vietnam (2007-2015), and is Honorary member of the Central and Eastern European Chamber of Commerce (CEEC) in Vietnam.
