CONCEPT NOTE

Title of Event

Regional Workshop on Laboratory Quality and Biosafety

Rationale:

Laboratory services constitute an integral part of the health services, and as such require continuous upgrading and strengthening in order to provide optimum quality of diagnostic testing and management of patient care. Reliable and timely results from laboratory investigations are critical elements in decision making in all aspects of health care, and are essential for the surveillance and control diseases of public health importance. In laboratory the use of good microbiological work practices, appropriate containment equipment, proper facility design, operation and maintenance, and administrative consideration to minimize the risk of worker injury and illness is being considered. The strengthening of laboratory biosafety prevents laboratory staff from unintentional exposure to pathogens and toxins or their accidental release.

The Ministry of Health in Cambodia works closely with WHO and other national and international partners, providing support and technical advice in many laboratory strengthening priority areas, including the national laboratory network, biosafety and biosecurity, information and quality management systems, specimen transfer and external quality assurance. According to the assessment of the national laboratory system in 2013, biorisk management received the lowest score (19%) of all areas accessed. Likewise, the average score for biosafety among 22 laboratories assessed was 45%. The assessment report concluded that "Biosafety is one of the biggest problems in medical laboratories in Cambodia".

In Cambodia, the ADB Greater Mekong Subregion (GMS) Health Security Project 2017–2022 will focus on 13 provinces, and cover a total of 42 district hospitals close to borders and economic corridors. The general outcome of the project is strengthening of public health security, accomplished through three main outputs:

- 1. Regional cooperation and communicable disease control in border areas improved,
- 2. National disease surveillance and outbreak response systems strengthened, and
- 3. Laboratory services and hospital Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) improved.

Activities included to achieve the third output will include conducting staff training on internal quality improvement to provincial, district and/or township hospitals; preparing standard operating procedures; providing basic equipment, supplies, and minor repairs for laboratories; setting up external quality assurance and audit systems for compliance with national biosafety and quality guidelines; and setting up laboratory networks. Strengthening laboratory capacity is one of the priority areas identified in the Asian Pacific Strategy for Emerging Diseases (APSED III), in line with IHR (2005) to achieve output 1 of GMS Health Security Project.

Objectives and Desired Outputs

Overall Objective:

The objective of the workshop is to improve the quality and bio-safety of laboratory services in the region.

Specific Objectives:

- 1. Networking and sharing information on Laboratory quality, Biosafety and bio risk management in the region,
- 2. Identify and assess priority biosafety gaps and challenges in the countries (shared assessment findings),
- 3. Promote animal and human health interface in biosafety and health security measures, and
- 4. Identify Key activities and strategies to promote biosafety and quality laboratory services.

Expected output:

- 1. Shared experience and knowledge of Laboratory quality, Biosafety and risk management among CLMV countries;
- 2. Established network for sharing information to improve quality of laboratory and biosafety among CLMV countries; and
- 3. List of key activities and strategies to promote biosafety and laboratory quality service in the region.

Deliverable

Workshop report including presentations, list of contact persons for laboratory networking, list of key activities and strategy to improve laboratory quality and biosafety.
