Following a series of bilateral consultation meetings with WGE focal points and stakeholders, several ideas and

feedback on possible demonstrations have been compiled under each priority theme. Informal consultations have been conducted with key technical officers of the Ministry of Environment (MoE), and civil society organizations (CSOs), non-government organizations, development partners, community-based organizations (CBOs), and the private sector to substantiate these ideas. These ideas will be further screened to assess climate change issues and followed by solutions that can be translated into demonstration proposals. These proposals will deem to benefit transboundary values, technological and financing innovation, and gender inclusiveness. A list of ideas and potential demonstrations for each priority theme is in the separate Program Annex.

Workshop Objectives

 To increase understanding among WGE stakeholders and implementing partners (technical departments from relevant ministries, CSOs, private sector, and CBOs) on how to develop their demonstration proposals

¹ The six priority themes of the CCESP are: (i) building climate and disaster resilience; (ii) facilitating low carbon transitions; (iii) promoting climate-smart landscapes; (iv) enhancing environmental quality through pollution control and sustainable waste management; (v) deploying digital technologies for climate actions and environmental sustainability; and (vi) financing low-carbon and climate-resilient infrastructure and technologies, including demonstrating climate and disaster risk financing instruments.

- 2. To identify and invite additional innovative ideas and demonstration proposals according to the six priority themes of the CCESP
- 3. To share how the demonstration proposal will be evaluated and selected based on the selection criteria

Venue and Participants

The consultation workshop will be conducted in hybrid mode (combining both virtual and in-person set-up) to allow those outside Cambodia, especially WGE coordinators, national GMS stakeholders from across the region, Ramboll technical leads and other key participants, to participate easily.

The on-site workshop will be conducted at the LBN Asian Hotel in Kampong Cham, Cambodia. The total number of participants will be 60–80, comprising national WGE coordinators and focal points, key technical officers of MoE, relevant ministries and departments, development partners, CSOs, CBOs, and the private sector. Social distancing will be practiced in the conference hall in accordance with Cambodia's national COVID-19 guidelines and procedures.
