

What's Next

Shift to One Health *actions* supported by existing One Health coordination

- Shift focus to *prevention and resilience* across all sectors
- ...not just health *response*

Use One Health...

- ...to include environment & sustainability objectives intra/inter-sector initiatives
- ...still need to reinforce 'collaborations'
- Needs to be more local?

What's needed

- Develop & implement financing & incentive mechanisms for One Health 'joint working'
- One Health workforce strengthening beyond zoonosis control that supports sectoral needs

- Continue support for regional technical assistance linked to existing One Health networks & resources
- Recommendations to strengthen outbreak response mechanisms

Next steps on One Health in the GMS

ADB's commitment to OH and the GMS health cooperation strategy – updating the strategy in 2022

Commit to country diagnostics and economic analysis on OH in the GMS through the TA

DMCs to advocate and demand for OH approaches in agriculture and health projects in the GMS with their leadership and MOFs

Bring the ministries of finance to the center of the OH discussion at country and regional level – next GMS SOMS meeting will include OH

Continue networking on One Health through seminars like this event – GMS can continue to facilitate this work

Next steps on One Health in the GMS

Seize upon the green recovery - prepare business prospects and operational research on OH for DMCs financing in the medium and long term – supported by DPs

Building new partnerships with private and public institutions leading to scaled-up support for OH at country and regional level

Work with technical agencies (WHO, FAO, OIE) to ensure consistency and alignment with national policies and strategies on OH
